

Course Overview

The 2024 Kansas Opioid and Stimulant Conference offers attendees an in-depth exploration of the ongoing prescription drug, opioid, and stimulant crisis affecting Kansas. Through dynamic sessions and expert-driven conversations, participants will deepen their understanding of the wide-ranging effects these substances have on individuals, communities, and public health systems. This conference is a project of DCCCA Prevention Services and the Kansas Prescription Drug and Opioid Advisory Committee and is funded by the Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services through the State Opioid Response Initiative and the Kansas Department of Health and Environment Overdose Data to Action Initiative.

Target Audience

This conference is designed for medical doctors, nurses, health care providers, pharmacists, prevention specialists, community coalitions, public health professionals, educators, legislators, treatment providers, addiction specialists, social workers, psychologists, law enforcement, emergency medical services, and all others with an interest in the opioid crisis in Kansas.

1. Evaluate the impact of prescription drug, opioid, and stimulant misuse in Kansas to propose solutions.
2. Assess evidence-based strategies and best practices to enhance prevention of prescription drug, opioid, and stimulant misuse.
3. Analyze evidence-based strategies and best practices for treating and supporting recovery from Opioid and Stimulant Use Disorders.
4. Identify and apply best practices and resources for effective pain management and responsible opioid prescribing.
5. Examine best practices and resources for law enforcement and first responders addressing opioid, stimulant, and drug-related cases.
